Using Complete Sentences

EXERCISE 1 Identifying Sentences and Sentence Fragments

Read the research notes below. Label each sentence fragment as *F* (fragment). Label each complete sentence as *D* (declarative), *IM* (imperative), *IN* (interrogative), or *E* (exclamatory).

EXAMPLE F The Globe Theatre, which Shakespeare's own company paid for and built.

Remember that a complete sentence requires a subject and a verb, and it must also express a complete thought.

Fragment:

After it burned down.

Sentences:

It burned down.

After it burned down, the Globe was rebuilt.

2. ____ Later, paid the company about 12.5 percent of the cost to build the Globe.
