EXERCISE 1 Choosing Correct Pronouns

Circle the correct pronoun in parentheses. Label it *S* (subject) or *O* (object).

EXAMPLE My family and (me, I) enjoy playing and watching baseball. **S**

To help you choose the correct pronoun in a compound structure, try each pronoun separately in the sentence.

- The best pitchers of us all are Larry and (me, I).
- Last year, I went with Brad and (he, him) to a baseball camp.
- (Them, They) and I were on the championship team.
- Brad was thrilled when Coach Banks gave (him, he) the trophy.
- (Us, We) and my best friend Todd are big fans of the Pittsburgh Pirates.
- I gave (he, him) a Pirates shirt for his birthday.
- My dad took Todd and (we, us) to a Pirates game last July.
- Dad bought scorecards and lunch for (we, us) all.
- My sister Emily likes the Pirates, too, but (she, her) and my mom could not go to the game.
- Between you and (me, I), I hope the Pirates win the next World Series.

EXERCISE 2 Proofreading Sentences

Cross out any incorrectly used subject or object pronouns, and write the correct pronoun. If a sentence is correct as is, write *C*.

EXAMPLE My teacher asked Todd and I to write a report about an athlete. **me**

- Him and I chose Roberto Clemente, a baseball player, as our subject.
- Ms. Gottlieb had handed out a list of possible names to our and we classmates.
- The librarian gave you and her an interesting biography of Clemente.
- In 1952, baseball scouts in Puerto Rico noticed he and his talents.
- It didn't take him long to become an outstanding right fielder.
- Do you or them know if Clemente played his entire career with the Pirates?
- I read that him and his Pirates teammates won two World Series.
- The first Hispanic member of the Baseball Hall of Fame was him.
- How did him and his wife find time to do so much charity work?
- It shocked my friends and I to learn that Clemente died in a 1972 plane crash; he was on his way to Nicaragua to deliver supplies for earthquake victims.
