### EXERCISE 1 Editing Sentences

Circle any errors in the use of *who* and *whom*, and write the correct word. If a sentence has no errors, write *C*.

#### Hint

Use *who* as a subject or predicate nominative.

Use *whom* as a direct object, an indirect object, or an object of a preposition.

**EXAMPLE** A person whom wants to be vice president must be at least thirty-five years old. *who*

- To who is that book about vice presidential trivia dedicated?
- Whom was the vice president who received the Nobel Peace Prize?
- The vice president who had written a song that became a #1 hit in 1958 was Charles Dawes.
- George Clinton, whom served as vice president for two presidents, was born in New York in 1739.
- The president whom had the youngest vice president was James Buchanan.
- Who was the oldest living former vice president?
- In 1832, John C. Calhoun, whom was the seventh vice president, resigned to take a seat in the Senate.
- When Vice President Spiro Agnew resigned, he was replaced by Gerald Ford, who became president when Richard Nixon resigned less than a year later.
- Who did Gerald Ford nominate as vice president?
- The politician who I researched and wrote about was Vice President Aaron Burr.
